
Why the 'Trinity Doctrine' is so damaging to believers!

1. **It is unscriptural!** Truth be told, the 'Trinity Doctrine' actually forces people to **oppose** the Almighty's written word. The Almighty, His prophets, and His Word say He is one person. The 'Trinity Doctrine' teaches people He is a composite being made up of 'three persons'.

2. **It creates confusion for the believer.**

Is the Almighty one person... or three persons? People naturally find it difficult (*if not impossible*) to understand, or relate to a 'three person' being. Who can relate to one being with three persons in it? **No one!**

3. **It keeps people from knowing and proclaiming the Almighty's name.** If the Almighty is 'three persons', and all three are gathered together (as is often portrayed in old paintings)... What do you call **Him**? What is **His** Name?

Trinitarians teach people to worship and pray to Three Persons

Here is an exact quote from a 'Trinitarian' website:

*"So our one God is present in **three persons**: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is the doctrine of the Trinity. It is appropriate to worship all three, and we should be careful to ensure that our worship of one person of the Trinity does not overshadow our worship of any other person of the Trinity. And to fail to worship any member of the Trinity is sin."*

The Catholic Pope Francis, told people on January 11, 2015...

"We usually pray to Jesus," Francis said. "When we pray the 'Our Father,' we pray to the Father. But we don't pray so much to the Holy Spirit. It is so important to pray to the Holy Spirit," he said.

Catholics, as well as many Protestants, are teaching their followers they should worship and pray to **three separate entities!** This is totally unscriptural and is in fact, **paganistic**.

The New Testament aligns itself perfectly with the beliefs of the Jewish people who believe the Almighty is one (really one), as they were correctly taught in the Old Testament.

The 'Trinity Doctrine' should **never** be associated with the Christian faith. The Almighty is **ONE** person and He has revealed Himself as one person in the face of **YAH**-shua, the MessiYah. (2 Corinthians 4:6)

The 'Trinity Doctrine' was never part of the early church. They knew the Almighty Father manifested **Himself** to us in human form, **as** the Son, just as Isaiah prophesied.

*For unto us a Child is born,
Unto us a Son is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called Wonderful,
Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father,
Prince of Peace.*

Isaiah 9:6

When these truths are taught by Gentile believers, will we begin to see the end-time revival among the Jewish people.

Salvation is a gift for you!

Salvation is a gift that we receive by faith. We cannot earn it through our deeds or works. We cannot obtain it by being a "good person" or by attending church. Yahshua earned it **for us** by dying for **our** sins on the cross. Everyone who calls upon the name of Yahshua will be saved; so call upon Him now. Tomorrow is not assured.

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Why we are failing to provoke Jewish people to Jealousy

"if by any means I may provoke to jealousy those who are my flesh and save some of them."

The Apostle Paul... Romans 11:14

Three times Paul speaks about the Almighty's purpose in using the Gentiles to provoke Israel to jealousy. Sadly, very few Jewish people are provoked to jealousy by Gentile believers. Why is this?

There are two main reasons:

1. Most Gentile believers use an incorrect name for the Jewish MessiYah.

If we could go back in time and ask the disciples, "*Would you take us to see Jesus?*" They would have gotten a puzzled look on their face and said, "*Who?*"

You see, the disciples never knew the MessiYah by that name. They would have said, "*Please come, we want you to meet Yahshua, the MessiYah!*"

The History of the name 'Jesus'

For fifteen hundred years after our Savior walked the earth, the world had **never** heard the name 'Jesus'. Why? Because that name did not exist.

Notice, you will not find the name 'Jesus' in the King James Bible published in 1611. Instead, you will find the name 'Iesus'. The name 'Jesus' first appeared in the Revised King James Bible published in 1769, **just 249 years ago!** *

* Perhaps the biggest difference between the 1611 and 1769 versions of the King James Bible is spelling. For instance, there was no letter "J" in 1611 so "Jesus" was spelled "Iesus."

By 1769 our Saviors 'Heaven sent', Hebrew name Yahshua, had been transliterated three times, in three different languages. *

* transliterate: to write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or language.

- The first transliteration was from Hebrew to Greek.
- The second, from Greek to Latin.
- The third, from Latin to English.

Tragically, the result of these 'man-made' changes was the complete removal of the Almighty Father's name!

"To remove the name is to extinguish the person"

"In the Scriptures there is the closest possible relationship between a person and his name, the two being practically equivalent, so that to remove the name is to extinguish the person. To forget God's name is to depart from Him."

The Almighty Father's name is YAH.

Scripture tells us the Father's name is YAH. King David tells us plainly in Psalm 68:4 that the Almighty's name is YAH.

*"Sing to God, sing praises to His name;
Extol Him who rides on the clouds, By His name YAH, and rejoice before Him."*

The prophet Isaiah tells us the Almighty's name is YAH in Isaiah 12:2.

*Behold, God is my salvation,
I will trust and not be afraid;
'For YAH, the LORD, is my strength and song;
He also has become my salvation.'*

We also can see the Almighty's name is **YAH** in Revelation 19:1-6 as the multitudes praise Him saying, Hallelu**YAH**! Which means, "Praise **YAH**!"

In the Old Testament when you see 'Yahweh', it is the Almighty's name YAH, **followed** by a 'descriptor'. The descriptor is the word 'weh', which means, "The Self-Existent one" (I AM). So, the name YAH-weh means, 'YAH - The Self-Existent one' (I AM).

In Mathew 1:20-21, an "angel of the Lord" appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him he was to name the new born Savior, **YAH-shua**.

"and you shall call His name Yahshua"
Matthew 1:21; Luke 2:21

We must keep in mind that the angel who spoke to Joseph did not speak to Joseph in English, Latin or Greek, but spoke to him in own language... Hebrew. This 'Heaven sent' **Hebrew name**, was **YAH-shua!**

As Savior, YAH now combines His name with His **highest** 'descriptor' ever! This descriptor is the word 'shua', which means "is salvation". When you combine the Father's name YAH, with the word shua (YAH-shua), it means, "YAH is salvation!"

The Almighty Father is proclaiming **His highest name to us, as Savior!** This is why the name YAH-shua, is the name above all names!

When Gentile believers begin calling the Savior by His true Hebrew name, the Jewish people will certainly become jealous.

2. Jewish Believers Reject the 'Trinity Doctrine'... for Good Reason

The 'Trinity doctrine' is the main reason why Jewish people are not 'provoked to jealousy'. Does anyone believe Moses would have been 'provoked to jealousy' by Gentiles espousing the Trinity Doctrine?

Remember, the Jewish people were warned continually to stay **far away** from pagan 'polytheism' by the Almighty Himself:

*"Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God,
the LORD is one!"*
Deuteronomy 6:4

If you study the 'Trinity' in other religions, you will see the relationship between the 'Trinity Doctrine' and the false gods of these religions.

There are a number of faiths that consider Christians to be idolaters and infidels because some try to push the theory of 'three persons' in one Almighty. The 'three person' theory is foreign to true Christianity and to Jewish people that believe in the one Almighty of heaven and earth.

How can the Jewish people accept, or even understand the unscriptural 'Trinity Doctrine' which attempts to tell them that the Almighty is 'three persons'.

The Jewish people are absolutely correct in believing in the 'absolute oneness' of the Almighty, and that same oneness can be proven in the New Testament. It is biblically incorrect to speak of the Almighty as a 'trinity' or 'trio' of 'persons.'

"Persons," in reference to the Almighty, is not in the Bible, it is not scriptural, nor is there a commandment to worship 'three persons'. This makes the doctrine of the Trinity an unsound doctrine.
