
The Almighty's true name...

The Almighty's true Hebrew name **YAH-shua**, has been ***needlessly*** transliterated ***three times*** over the centuries! First to 'Ieousus', then to 'Iesus' and then to 'Jesus' in the 17th century. Because of this, our Savior's real name 'Yahshua', is ***virtually unknown*** to people!

Yahshua has blessed us however, because of our love and faith in Him! He allowed us to grow spiritually through the names that people have known Him by over the years. Names such as 'Ieousus', 'Iesus', and 'Jesus' have been a blessing to those who used them because they had not previously known His true name.

When I talk with people about the name Yahshua, they often have one of the following responses:

1 ***I'm not Jewish, I speak English***

I reply a that a person doesn't have to be Jewish, or be fluent in Hebrew to say a Hebrew name. For example, we say 'Netanyahu' don't we? We say the names of people from foreign lands routinely without feeling the need to 'first' change them into 'our' language.

2 ***But, everybody uses the name 'Jesus'***

To this, I call upon the wisdom of my mother who said to me, "If everybody jumps off a cliff are you going to jump off too?"

#3 ***Names are really not that important to God***

To this, I politely ask if they read the Bible regularly.

Many Believers are not understanding the true issues regarding our Savior's name. This is not about what language a person speaks, or what country a person lives in.

This is about our Savior's 'Heaven sent' Hebrew name being ***systematically dismantled and destroyed*** by multiple 'man-made' transliterations.

These are the real issues regarding our Saviors name

The Almighty Father gave clear instructions,

"You, shall call His name Yahshua"

1. The Almighty Father had a **purpose** for sending an angel and giving these instructions to Yosef. The Almighty Father wanted His Old Testament name **YAH**, to **remain** His name in the New Testament!
2. The names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' **completely eliminate** The Almighty Fathers name.
3. Because the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' **eliminate** the Fathers name, **they have eliminated His identity** as being **our Savior**.
4. Using the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua', people can no longer easily **identify** that **YAH**, The Almighty Father is in fact our Savior... **for the identity of our Savior is found in His name!**
5. Because the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua' have **removed** The Almighty Fathers name, He has been **robbed** of the **glory** that belongs to **Him** as being **our Savior**.

I do not believe these issues are trivial. I believe these are **great wrongs** that need to be **made right** by **this** generation of Believers.

I hope **you** believe these issues are **meaningful** and **important** too.

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YAH YAHWEH YAHSHUA

What do these names mean?

YAH

YAH, is The Almighty Father's name

Sometimes you will hear people say that 'YAH' is the shortened, or *abbreviated* form of The Almighty Father's name, but that is not correct. YAH **is** the name of The Almighty Father.

King David tells us clearly in Psalm 68:4 that the Almighty Father's name is 'YAH'.

*Sing to God, sing praises to
His name; Extol Him who rides on
the clouds, By His name **YAH**,
And rejoice before Him.*

The prophet Isaiah tells us the Almighty Father's name is 'YAH' in Isaiah 12:2.

*Behold, God is my salvation,
I will trust and not be afraid;
'For **YAH**, the LORD,
is my strength and song; He also
has become my salvation.'*

YAH: (YAH - Strong's H3050)

YAH-weh

YAH-weh, is The Almighty Father's name with a 'descriptor' added.

The name 'Yahweh' (YAH-weh) is the Fathers name YAH, **followed** by a 'descriptor'. The descriptor is the Hebrew word 'weh', which means, 'The Self-Existent one' (I AM). So, the name YAH-weh means, 'YAH - The Self-Existent one'.

YAH-shua

YAH-shua, is The Almighty Father's name with His highest descriptor added.

The Almighty Father waited to give us His **highest** name until He came to us **Himself** in the **New** Testament!

Now, YAH combines His name with His **highest** 'descriptor'! This 'descriptor' is the Hebrew word 'shua', which means '**is salvation**'. When you combine The Almighty's name YAH, with the word 'shua', it means, "**YAH is salvation**"!

The Almighty Father is proclaiming **His** name to us **as Savior!** This is why the name **YAH-shua, is the name above every name!** (*Philippians 2:9*)

When a person believes in the name YAH-shua, he is believing in what that name **means** - that YAH, The Almighty Father, **is our Savior who was manifest (made visible) in human form.**

... **God** *was manifested in the flesh...*
1 Timothy 3:16

Notice, the apostle Paul does **not** say God's 'son' was manifested in the flesh.

What about the name Jesus?

If we could go back in time and ask the disciples, "Would you take us to see Jesus?" They would have gotten a puzzled look on their face and said, "Who?"

You see, the disciples never knew the MessiYah by that name. They would have said, "Please come, we want you to meet **Yahshua, the MessiYah!**"

The History of the name 'Jesus'

For fifteen hundred years after our Savior walked the earth, the world had **never** heard the name 'Jesus'. Why? Because that name **did not exist**.

Notice, you will **not** find the name 'Jesus' in the King James Bible published in 1611. Instead, you will find the name 'Iesus'. The name 'Jesus' **first** appeared in the Revised King James Bible published in 1769, **just 249 years ago!** *

** Perhaps the biggest difference between the 1611 and 1769 versions of the King James Bible is spelling. For instance, there was no letter "J" in 1611 so "Jesus" was spelled "Iesus." (TheKJVstore.com)*

By 1769, our Saviors '*Heaven sent*' Hebrew name 'Yahshua', had been needlessly transliterated three times, in three different languages. *

*transliterate: to write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or language.

- The first transliteration was from Hebrew to Greek.
- The second, from Greek to Latin.
- The third, from Latin to English.

Tragically, the result of these 'man-made' changes was the complete **removal** of **The Almighty Father's name!**

"To remove the name is to extinguish the person"

*"In the Scriptures there is the closest possible relationship between a person and his name, the two being practically equivalent, so that **to remove the name is to extinguish the person.**"*

What about the name Yeshua?

Our Savior **Himself** tells us **His name** is **Yahshua**, not 'Yeshua' in John 17:11.

*...keep them in **Your name**, the name which **You have given Me...***

Scripture tells us the Father's name is **YAH**, not 'Ye'.

Many scriptures in the Bible can be found proclaiming The Almighty Father's name is **YAH**, but **there are no scriptures** proclaiming His name is 'Ye'.

In Heaven the great multitude are shouting "Hallelu**Yah**"... not Hallelu**YE**. (Rev 1: 1,3,4,6)

The name 'Yeshua', like the name 'Jesus', **completely eliminates** The Almighty Fathers name.

Both the names 'Jesus' and 'Yeshua', **rob** The Almighty Father of **His name, His identity** and the **glory** that is **due Him alone** as being **our Savior**.
