

## The Almighty Father appears to Moses

When The Almighty Father appeared to Moses in the burning bush, Moses asked His name.

The Almighty Father gave Moses this reply:

*"I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'*  
Exodus 3:14

It is inarguable that "I AM" is the name of **The Almighty Father**.

Ever since this name was spoken by **The Almighty Father**, the Israelites considered the name "I AM" to be **sacred**.

This name was not to be used in vain or bestowed on **anyone** other than **The Almighty Father Himself**.

The Gospel of John tells us that one day the Pharisees came to question Yahshua.

Yahshua responded to their questions saying,

*"I tell you the truth,  
before Abraham was born, I AM!"*  
John 8:58

Here, Yahshua calls **Himself** the ancient and sacred name of The Almighty Father, 'I AM'.

Yahshua proclaimed to them (**and us**) that **He** was 'I AM', **The Almighty Father** of Exodus 3:14 that they **purported** to worship.

The Pharisees became enraged when Yahshua made the **proclamation** that **He** was 'I AM' and they picked up stones to kill Him for blasphemy.

Sadly, there are many people today, who just like the Pharisees, **reject** our Savior's **own words** proclaiming **His identity** as being 'I AM', **The Almighty Father come manifested in flesh**.

## Yahshua said, "the true worshipers will worship the Father"

*"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth"*  
John 4:23

According to Yahshua, "the true worshipers" will worship **the Father**.

And the Scriptures show that people **worshiped Yahshua and He welcomed and accepted their worship!**

**Question:** Yahshua **clearly** said,

*"the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth"*

**Why** then, did Yahshua **allow** people **to worship Him?**

Moreover, **why** did Yahshua **accept their worship?**

**The Answer:**

**Yahshua allowed and accepted people's worship because He WAS The Almighty Father manifested in flesh!**

**The Almighty Father** manifested **Himself** in flesh as a man, to do **for us** what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. **He fulfilled the demands of the Law as a perfect man of flesh**, so that **He** could be **our perfect sacrifice, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior!** On the cross **He** took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon **Himself**, paying **our** price and thereby making us "**holy, blameless**" and "**without a single fault**" in His eyes. (Colossians 1:22)

This is the gospel! **This is the Good News! Everyone** who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him **now**. Tomorrow is not assured.

## The exclusive titles of The Almighty Father are bestowed on Yahshua MessiYah in the New Testament!

Most believers know **The Almighty Father** is the **preeminent** figure in the Old Testament. However, many believers do not recognize that the **The Almighty Father is the preeminent** figure in the **New Testament as well**. (Think of Philip not recognizing who Yahshua **actually** was in John 14:8-9)

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** is an **invisible** spirit. In the New Testament, **The Almighty Father is a visible man made of flesh**.

The Apostle Paul tells us that the **invisible** Father of the Old Testament **was manifested (made visible) in flesh**.

*"God was manifested in the flesh"*

1 Timothy 3:16

Paul **knew** **Yahshua MessiYah WAS The Almighty Father** manifested **in flesh** because we see that he used Old Testament scriptures which speak of **Yahweh**, and **applies those scriptures directly to Yahshua MessiYah**.

Romans 10:13 referencing Joel 2:32  
1 Corinthians 1:31 referencing Jeremiah 9:24  
1 Corinthians 2:16 referencing Isaiah 40:13  
1 Corinthians 10:26 referencing Psalm 24:1  
2 Corinthians 10:17 referencing Jeremiah 9:24

It is important to remember that **PRIOR** to Paul writing these scriptures (in which he **interchanges** Yahweh with Yahshua), he had been "**caught up to the third heaven**" where he received "**surpassingly great revelations**". (2 Corinthians 12:2-7)

This is **why** the apostle Paul calls Yahshua MessiYah,

*"our great God and Savior"* Titus 2:13

## Isaiah's Prophecy – The Almighty Father will be born as a 'Son' (human) made of flesh

The apostle Paul told us, ***“God was manifested in the flesh”*** and this is ***exactly*** what the prophet Isaiah ***foretold*** would happen.

Isaiah told us **The Almighty Father Himself** was going to come to us **born in flesh** as our Messiyah!

*For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given;  
And the government will be upon His shoulder.  
And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor,  
Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.*  
Isaiah 9:6

Isaiah told us our ***“Mighty God”*** and ***“Everlasting Father”*** would come to us as a ***“Son”*** because He was going to be ***“born” of a woman*** and would be a ***man made of flesh. He would be human!***

### Isaiah's prophesy is fulfilled

*“Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son,  
and they shall call His name Immanuel,”  
which is translated, “God with us.”*  
Matthew 1:23

Isaiah 9:6

*unto us a child is born, Unto us a Son is given...  
His name... Mighty God, Everlasting Father*

Matthew 1:23

*the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son...  
His name... God with us*

## The **exclusive** titles of **The Almighty Father** in the Old Testament are given to **Yahshua Messiyah** in the **New Testament!**

### “Savior”

Isaiah 43:3, 11, 45:17, 21; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Matthew 1:21; Acts 4:12; 2 Timothy 1:10; Titus 1:4, 2:13, 3:6; 2 Peter 1:1, 11

### “First and Last”

Isaiah 41:4, 44:6, 48:12; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Revelation 1:17, 18, 2:8, 22:13

### "Lord of Lords"

Deuteronomy 10:17, Psalm 136:3, 26; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Revelation 17:14, 19:16

The apostle John referred to Yahshua as the ***“the first and the last”*** (Revelation 1:17; 2:8; 22:13); ***“the true light”*** (John 1:9); the ***“bridegroom”*** (Revelation 21:2); ***“Savior of the world”*** (John 4:42; cf. Isaiah 43:3-11). He also attributed to Yahshua the role of ***“Redeemer”*** in Revelation 5:9.

The apostle Peter called Yahshua the ***“rock”*** and ***“stone”*** (1 Peter 2:6-8; Psalms 18:2; 95:1); and ***“the Chief Shepherd”*** (1 Peter 5:4). The apostle Paul referred to Yahshua as the ***“rock”*** (1 Corinthians 10:4) and the ***“bridegroom”*** (Ephesians 5:22-33).

The Old Testament role of ***“Redeemer”*** (Hosea 13:14; Psalms 130:7) is ***given to Yahshua*** by Paul in Titus 2:13-14.

***All of these titles are exclusive to The Almighty Father in the Old Testament but are given to Yahshua in the New Testament!***

The disciples were steeped in the Old Testament and would have only given ***these very same titles*** to Yahshua with the greatest of care. If they were not ***certain*** that Yahshua was **The Almighty Father manifested in flesh**, they would have ***NEVER*** bestowed these exclusive titles to ***Him***.

Here are more Old Testament scriptures which are speaking of **Yahweh and applied directly to Yahshua Messiyah**.

Hebrew 1:6 quotes Deuteronomy 32:43

Hebrew 1:8, 9 quotes Ps 45:6, 7

Hebrew 1:10-12 quotes Psalm 102:25-27

Philippians 2:10, 11 quotes Isaiah 45:23

Matthew 3:3 quotes Isaiah 40:3

## The Almighty Father is the 'I AM' - King, Shepherd and Savior

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** proclaims that **He** is ***‘I AM’*** (Exodus 3:14). In the New Testament, **Yahshua Messiyah** proclaims that **He** is ***‘I AM’*** (John 8:58).

Are there **two** ***‘I AM’s’***?

**No. The Almighty Father** is the **only** ***‘I AM’***.

The apostle Paul gives us understanding.

Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 8:6, ***“for us there is one God, the Father.”***

Paul tells us in Ephesians 4:6 there is ***“one God and Father of all.”***

Paul then tells us our ***“one God, the Father”***, manifested Himself in flesh.

***“God was manifested in the flesh”*** 1 Timothy 3:16

(Notice that Paul **does not say**, Gods 'son' was manifested in the flesh.)
