

The Almighty Father in the New Testament *“surpassingly great revelations”*

Most believers know **The Almighty Father** is the *preeminent* figure in the Old Testament. However, many believers do not recognize that the **The Almighty Father** *is the preeminent* figure in the **New Testament as well** (think of Philip not recognizing who Yahshua *actually* was in John 14:8-9).

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** is an **invisible** spirit. In the New Testament, ***The Almighty Father is a visible man made of flesh.***

The Apostle Paul tells us that the **invisible** Father of the Old Testament **was manifested (made visible) in flesh.**

“God was manifested in the flesh” 1 Timothy 3:16

Paul **knew** **Yahshua MessiYah WAS The Almighty Father** manifested **in flesh** because we see that he used Old Testament scriptures which speak of **Yahweh**, and **applies those scriptures directly to Yahshua MessiYah.**

Romans 10:13 referencing Joel 2:32
1 Corinthians 1:31 referencing Jeremiah 9:24
1 Corinthians 2:16 referencing Isaiah 40:13
1 Corinthians 10:26 referencing Psalm 24:1
2 Corinthians 10:17 referencing Jeremiah 9:24

It is **imperative** we **know** that **PRIOR** to Paul writing these scriptures (in which he **interchanges** Yahweh with Yahshua), he had been **“caught up to the third heaven” where he received “surpassingly great revelations”**. (2 Corinthians 12:2-7)

This is **why** in Titus 2:13, the apostle Paul calls Yahshua MessiYah...

“our great God and Savior”

Isaiah's Prophecy – The Almighty Father will be born as a 'Son' (human) made of flesh

The apostle Paul told us, “**God was manifested in the flesh**” and this is **exactly** what the prophet Isaiah **foretold** would happen.

Isaiah told us **The Almighty Father Himself** was going to come to us **born in flesh** as our MessiYah!

*For unto us **a Child is born**, Unto us a **Son** is given;
And the government will be upon His shoulder.
And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor,
Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6*

Isaiah told us our “**Mighty God**” and “**Everlasting Father**” would come to us as a “**Son**” because He was going to be “**born**” of a woman and would be a **man made of flesh**. **He would be human!**

We see Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled in Matthew 1:23,

*“Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a **Son**,
and they shall call His name Immanuel,”
which is translated, “**God with us**.”*

Isaiah 9:6

*unto us a **child** is **born**... Unto us a **Son** is given...
His name... Mighty God, Everlasting Father*

Matthew 1:23

*the virgin shall be with **child**, and bear a **Son**...
His name... God with us*

These **exclusive** titles of **The Almighty Father** in the Old Testament are bestowed on **Yahshua** in the **New Testament!**

“Savior”

Isaiah 43:3, 11, 45:17, 21; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Matthew 1:21; Acts 4:12; 2 Timothy 1:10; Titus 1:4, 2:13, 3:6; 2 Peter 1:1, 11

“First and Last”

Isaiah 41:4, 44:6, 48:12; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Revelation 1:17, 18, 2:8, 22:13

"Lord of Lords"

Deuteronomy 10:17, Psalm 136:3, 26; are applied **directly to Yahshua** in Revelation 17:14, 19:16

The apostle John referred to Yahshua as the **“the first and the last”** (Revelation 1:17; 2:8; 22:13); **“the true light”** (John 1:9); the **“bridegroom”** (Revelation 21:2); **“Savior of the world”** (John 4:42; cf. Isaiah 43:3-11). He also attributed to Yahshua the role of **“Redeemer”** in Revelation 5:9.

The apostle Peter called Yahshua the **“rock”** and **“stone”** (1 Peter 2:6-8; Psalms 18:2; 95:1); and **“the Chief Shepherd”** (1 Peter 5:4). The apostle Paul referred to Yahshua as the **“rock”** (1 Corinthians 10:4) and the **“bridegroom”** (Ephesians 5:22-33).

The Old Testament role of '**Redeemer**' (Hosea 13:14; Psalms 130:7) is **given to Yahshua** by Paul in Titus 2:13-14.

All of these titles are exclusive to The Almighty Father in the Old Testament but are bestowed on Yahshua in the New Testament!

The disciples were steeped in the Old Testament and would have only given **these very same titles** to Yahshua with the greatest of care. If they were not **certain** that Yahshua was **The Almighty Father manifested in flesh**, they would have **NEVER** bestowed these exclusive titles to **Him**.

Here are more Old Testament scriptures which are speaking of **Yahweh and applied directly to Yahshua MessiYah**.

Hebrew 1:6 quotes Deuteronomy 32:43

Hebrew 1:8, 9 quotes Ps 45:6, 7

Hebrew 1:10-12 quotes Psalm 102:25-27

Philippians 2:10, 11 quotes Isaiah 45:23

Matthew 3:3 quotes Isaiah 40:3

All of these titles are exclusive to **The Almighty Father in the Old Testament but are **bestowed on Yahshua** in the New Testament!**

The Almighty Father is the 'I AM' - King, Shepherd and Savior

In the Old Testament, **The Almighty Father** proclaims that **He** is **'I AM'** (Exodus 3:14). In the New Testament, **Yahshua MessiYah** proclaims that **He** is **'I AM'** (John 8:58).

Are there **two** 'I AM's?

No. The Almighty Father is the **only** 'I AM'.

The apostle Paul gives us understanding.

Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 8:6, ***"for us there is one God, the Father."***

Paul tells us in Ephesians 4:6 there is ***"one God and Father of all."***

Paul then tells us our ***"one God, the Father"***, manifested Himself in flesh.

"God was manifested in the flesh" 1 Timothy 3:16

(Notice that Paul **does not say**, Gods 'son' was manifested in the flesh.)

The Almighty Father appears to Moses

When The Almighty Father appeared to Moses in the burning bush, Moses asked His name.

The Almighty Father gave Moses this reply:

*“I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites:
‘I AM has sent me to you.’ Exodus 3:14*

Ever since this name was spoken by **The Almighty Father**, the Israelites considered the name **“I AM”** to be **sacred**.

This name was not to be used in vain or bestowed on **anyone** other than **The Almighty Father Himself**.

The Gospel of John tells us that one day the Pharisees came to question Yahshua.

Yahshua responded to their questions saying,

“I tell you the truth, before Abraham was born, I AM!”
John 8:58

Here, Yahshua calls **Himself** the ancient and sacred name of The Almighty Father, **‘I AM’**.

Yahshua proclaimed to them **(and us)** that **He** was **‘I AM’, The Almighty Father** of Exodus 3:14 that they **purported** to worship.

The Pharisees became enraged when Yahshua made this **proclamation** that **He** was **‘I AM’** and they picked up stones to kill Him for blasphemy.

Sadly, there are many people today, who just like the Pharisees, **reject** our Savior’s **own words** proclaiming **His identity** as being **‘I AM’, The Almighty Father come manifested in flesh**.

If Yahshua was The Almighty Father manifested in flesh... *Why did He pray?*

The **key** to understanding why Yahshua MessiYah (*The Father manifested in flesh*) prayed, can be found in these three scriptures: Matthew 3:15; Hebrews 2:17 and Psalms 65:2.

Matthew 3:13-15

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. And John tried to **prevent** Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by **You, and are You coming to me?**"
But Jesus answered and said to him, "Permit it to be so **now**, for thus it is fitting for us **to fulfill all righteousness.**"

Hebrews 2:17

"Therefore He (Yahshua MessiYah) had to be made like His brothers in every respect."

Questions:

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh **need** to be baptized?

Why would The Almighty Father manifested in flesh **need** to pray?

The Answer:

Yahshua MessiYah prayed **for the same reason** that He was baptized... to **fulfill all righteousness as a man made of flesh.**

The Almighty Father came into the world **as a man made of flesh** to fulfill every 'jot and tittle' of the Law on **our** behalf... **as our kinsmen-redeemer.**

If **The Almighty Father** failed to ‘fulfill all righteousness’ ***as a man made of flesh***, His entire mission to save us would fail!

Yahshua MassiYah (**God manifested in flesh**), had to ‘fulfill all righteousness’ ***as a man made of flesh***, just like us! He had to ***literally*** be our ‘**kinsman redeemer**’ to be our **Savior!**

We read in Psalms 65:2

“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”

Notice, scripture does not say that ***some*** flesh will come, or ***most*** flesh will come, but it declares, “To You **All** flesh will come.”

“O You who hear prayer,
To You **all** flesh will come.”

The answer to why Yahshua prayed is quite simple. Yahshua was made ***“like his brothers in every respect”***. Yahshua was ***genuinely human; He was born of flesh***. (Romans 9:5; Isaiah 9:6).

Being born of flesh, and in order to ***fulfill all righteousness***, Yahshua MessiYah **Himself** prayed as scripture states **all** flesh will do.

Yahshua had to ‘fulfill all righteousness’
as a man made of flesh, just like us!

He had to ***literally*** be our ‘**kinsman redeemer**’
to be our **Savior!**

Yahshua said,
“the true worshipers will worship the Father”
Yahshua welcomes and accepts people’s worship

*“But the hour is coming, and now is, **when the true worshipers** will worship **the Father** in spirit and truth”*

John 4:23

According to Yahshua, ***“the true worshipers”*** will worship **the Father**.

And the Scriptures show that people **worshiped Yahshua**.

From the very beginning of Yahshua’s life, **He** was worshiped.

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, “Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East **and have come to worship Him**”.

And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and **worshiped Him**.

Matthew 2:2, 11



Yahshua was worshiped as a baby.

Yahshua was worshiped by His disciples.

Yahshua was worshiped by everyday people.

Yahshua was worshiped by demon possessed people.

Yahshua was worshiped after His resurrection.

Yahshua was worshiped and He welcomed people's worship.

The Scriptures not only show that **Yahshua was worshiped**, they show that He **welcomed** and **accepted** worship.

In **every** instance, Yahshua **welcomed** and **accepted** people's worship.

Two memorable examples of Yahshua **accepting worship** occurred just after His resurrection when "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb."

So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word. And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, "Rejoice!"

So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him.

Matthew 28:8-9

Question: Yahshua **clearly** said,

***"the true worshipers will worship the Father
in spirit and truth"***

Why then, did Yahshua **allow... and accept** people worshiping **Him**?

The Answer:

Yahshua allowed and accepted people's worship because He WAS The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

**Philip said, “Lord, show us the Father.
That is all we need.”**

Philip said, “Lord, show us the Father. That is all we need.”

Yahshua answered Philip saying,

Philip, I have been with you for a long time.

Don't you know who I am?

If you have seen me, you have seen the Father.

How can you ask me to show you the Father?

John 14:8-9

Believer, if **you** asked Yahshua to show you the Father, what do you think He would say to you? Would He answer **you** as He answered Philip?

“I have been with you for a long time. Don't you know who I am?”

Salvation is a gift for you

Salvation is a **gift** we receive when we call upon Yahshua MessiYah,
The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

The **gift** of salvation cannot be earned by our deeds, works or fruitless self-righteous attempts at ‘keeping the Law’. We cannot obtain it by being a “good person” or by attending church.

We can only receive our salvation as a **gift** from Yahshua MessiYah ***to us***.

Everyone who calls upon the name of Yahshua **will be saved**, so call upon Him **now**. Tomorrow is not assured.

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
