
In the Old Testament, a person teaching The Almighty's people to worship **'three distinct persons'** would have been put to death!

The Jewish people were warned continually to stay **far away** from pagan 'polytheism' by The Almighty Father **Himself**:

"Hear, O Israel: the LORD our God, the LORD is one!" Deuteronomy 6:4

What divides Jewish people from Trinitarianism is whether The Almighty is One (**singular**), or a composite of **'three persons'**. The bedrock of Judaism has always been **true monotheism** - the belief that The Almighty is a **singular** One. This belief in **one singular** Almighty is what distinguished the Jewish people from their neighbors, who during antiquity were **polytheistic**.

The Jewish people have always safeguarded their **monotheism** against Trinitarian proselytizing. To them, the Catholic and Protestant 'Trinity Doctrine' is blasphemous, for they believe the 'trinity god' to be a **different** god than The Almighty God of Scripture.

How can the Jewish people (**or any Believer**) accept the 'Trinity Doctrine' which tells them The Almighty is comprised of **'three distinct persons'**, when this **refutes** the very words of **The Almighty Father Himself**?

In the Bible, false prophets claimed to speak the Word of God, but instead spread false teachings **contrary** to The Fathers own words. Any prophet who **contradicted** what The Almighty Father had previously revealed in His Word, **proved himself to be a false prophet**.

To **protect** His people, The Almighty Father commanded **false prophets** be put to death.

Isaiah's prophecy - Our **"Mighty God"** and **"Everlasting Father"** would come to us manifested in flesh

This is what the prophet Isaiah **told us was going to happen!** The Almighty Father **Himself** was going to come to us born in flesh as a man!

*For unto us a Child is born, Unto us a Son is given; And the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, **Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.*** Isaiah 9:6

Isaiah told us our **"Mighty God"** and **"Everlasting Father"** would come to us as a **"Son"** because He was going to be **"born" of a woman** and would be a **man made of flesh. He would be human!**

We see Isaiah's prophesy fulfilled in Matthew 1:23,

*"Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a **Son**, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "**God with us.**"*

The invisible Father of the Old Testament, **manifested Himself in flesh as a visible man in the New Testament. The Almighty Father** manifested Himself in flesh as a man, to do **for us** what we could **NEVER** do for ourselves. **He fulfilled the demands of the Law as a perfect man of flesh**, so that **He** could be **our perfect sacrifice, 'kinsman redeemer' and Savior!** On the cross **He** took **ALL** of our sins (**past, present and future**) and put them upon **Himself**, paying **our** price and thereby making us **"holy, blameless"** and **"without a single fault"** in His eyes. (Colossians 1:22) This is the gospel! **This is the Good News!**

Biblical monotheism versus Trinitarian monotheism

The Jewish people have always believed in the **absolute singularity of God**. However, long after the Bible was written, Christian theology saw a departure from that **uncompromising** monotheism.

In 325 AD, a very **different** form of 'monotheism' appeared. This new monotheism declared that God was **not one 'singular' being**, but was instead 'one Being' which was comprised of 'three distinct persons, each of whom were fully God'.

Today, many Trinitarian scholars acknowledge that the Trinity is a **post-biblical** concept. For example, Baptist scholar Roger Olson writes:

"The doctrine of the Trinity developed gradually after the completion of the New Testament... The full blown doctrine of the Trinity was spelled out in the fourth century at two great ecumenical councils: Nicaea (325 A.D.) and Constantinople (381 A.D.) ... Both the practices and documents of the church finally led early Christian leaders to propose a trinitarian model of God, but the formation of this model took place over many years..."

This new definition of monotheism had its own unique terms such as 'hypostasis', 'co-equal' and 'co-eternal'. While these terms are found in their creeds, **they cannot be found in the Bible itself**. Clearly, this new definition of monotheism would be inconceivable to The Almighty Father, His prophets, and His people of old. He told them that *"He is God and there is no one else; He is God and there is no one like Him"* (Isaiah 46:9). They believed Him! Their entire faith began and ended on the point that their Father alone is God.

Where did this new definition of monotheism come from?

The teaching of 'a first person', 'a second person' and 'a third person', came from the **Catholic church** when it formulated the 'Trinity Doctrine'.

The 'Trinity Doctrine' was enshrined by the **Catholic church** at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

Shortly thereafter, the Catholic church forced believers to accept the 'Trinity Doctrine' or face condemnation, excommunication and worse. It is well documented in history that multitudes of people were tortured and put to death for refusing to accept the 'Trinity Doctrine'. ***This fact alone should have sounded the alarm in the Christian world concerning the 'Trinity Doctrine'.***

Other **false** doctrines of the Catholic church

- The **"infallibility"** of the Catholic Church.
- **Catholic tradition** is **equal** to the **Bible**.
(*Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 82*).
- The **'Immaculate conception'** - Mary was born without sin and lived a sinless life.
- **Mary is the intercessor between God and man.**
- **The Assumption of Mary** - Mary never died.
- **Purgatory** - a place of suffering for sins not repented of before dying.
- **Indulgences** - paying money to the Catholic church to get your loved ones out of purgatory.
- **Praying to dead saints.**

How did the Protestant Church embrace this **Catholic Doctrine**?

*"At the time of the Reformation, **the Protestant Church took over the doctrine of the Trinity without serious examination.**"*

It is strangely ironic to hear Protestants disparage the 'Catholic church' for its many false doctrines, while being totally unaware that the 'Trinity Doctrine' they so staunchly embrace **comes directly from the Catholic church.**

Now, **both** Catholic and Protestant Churches **pray to, and worship** 'three distinct persons'

The Catholic Pope Francis told people on January 11, 2015...

*"We usually **pray to Jesus**," Francis said.*

*"When we pray the Our Father, we **pray to the Father**. But we don't pray so much to the Holy Spirit. It is so important to **pray to the Holy Spirit**."*

Three quotes from well known **Protestant** websites:

1. *"So our one God is present in **three persons**: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. **This is the doctrine of the Trinity. It is appropriate to worship all three, and we should be careful to ensure that our worship of one person of the Trinity does not overshadow our worship of any other person of the Trinity.**"*

2. *"So, in general, pray to the Father; but occasionally, to express **their** Personhood and **your own love for them**, telling the Spirit and the Son that **you love them** and that **you would like them** to come in fullness is a good thing".*

3. *"There is only one God, eternally existing in **three persons**: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Who are co-equal in their essential nature, attributes, and perfection; and **each of Whom is to be honored and worshiped as God**".*

Please look at the words used in these quotes

*"It is appropriate to **worship all three**"*

*"**their personhood**" "**your love for them**"*

*"**each is to be honored and worshiped as God**"*

Does this sound like **Biblical monotheism** to you?

Trinitarians will always emphatically say that they are monotheistic and there is one God. However, here is the deception. The Trinitarians one God, is **not** the **singular** Almighty of scripture. Their god is instead, **one being** that is comprised of **'three distinct persons, each fully God'**.

These three **together**, make one god. Trinitarians believe in, and **worship three divine figures** even though their lips are saying, "one God."

Trinitarians say that they are monotheistic and there is one God. However, their **actions** speak much louder than their words, for they **pray to three**, and they **worship three**. By doing this they prove that in **reality**, Trinitarianism **is a polytheistic form of religion**.
