

Yahshua proclaims He is “I AM”

In the Old Testament The Almighty Father, declares He is “**I AM**”. (Exodus 3:14) In the New Testament, Yahshua MessiYah declares that He is “**I AM**”.

In the Gospel of John, Yahshua refers to Himself as “**I AM**” eight times. In the book of Revelation, Yahshua refers to Himself as “**I AM**” seven times. **When Yahshua states that He is “I AM”, He is proclaiming that He is the Almighty Father of Exodus 3:14 manifested in flesh!**

Philip learns from Yahshua that the Father is *not* a ‘distinct’ person from Himself

In John 14:8-9, Philip asks Yahshua to show them the Father,

“Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us.”

Yahshua seems genuinely perplexed by Philips request... and responds,

*“Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? **He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, ‘Show us the Father’?**”*

Philip did not comprehend that The Almighty Father is an invisible Spirit and that only by manifesting Himself in flesh could He fulfill ‘the Law’ on our behalf, become our sacrifice, substitute, high priest, ‘kinsman redeemer’ and Savior.

All these roles required a man to fulfill them, and that is why The Almighty Father **Himself**, the **only Savior** (Isaiah 43:11; Isaiah 45:21; Hosea 13:4) came into the world as a man made of flesh.

Like Philip, many fail to comprehend that The Almighty Father can be in Heaven filling the universe with His majesty and yet, at the same time, He can manifest His glory among us ***in the tent of a human body***.

Philip walked with, talked with, ate with and witnessed the miracles of Yahshua every day... and yet Philip did not know who Yahshua truly was!

Have you, like Philip, been walking and talking with Yahshua every day and not yet realized who Yahshua truly is? He is The Almighty Father manifested in flesh.

Does your Trinitarian church (*do you*) believe that Yahshua MessiYah is The Almighty Father manifested in flesh?

Why I don’t go to a Trinitarian church

The ‘Trinity Doctrine’ comes **directly** from the Catholic church.

Because of this Catholic doctrine, Trinitarian churches **refute** The Almighty Father’s own Words regarding His singularity. Trinitarian churches teach The Almighty is not a **singular** one, but a composite of **three distinct persons** “**each fully God**”.

Trinitarian churches teach their followers to **worship and pray to three distinct persons** who are “**each fully God**”. This is **polytheism** regardless of the *linguistics* and ‘wordplay’ Trinitarians use to justify this unscriptural and false doctrine.

In the Old Testament, **someone teaching** The Almighty’s people to **worship and pray to ‘three distinct persons’** who are “**each fully God**” **would have been put to death**.

Trinitarian churches create **confusion** for the believer. Is The Almighty a **singular** one, or is He a composite of **three distinct persons**? Who can understand, relate to, or have a **personal relationship** to one being with ‘**three persons**’ in it? **No one!**

Three times the Bible says there is **one** God, **the Father**. Because I know Yahshua is God, I know He is **the Father**.

The Father says He is our **only Savior** and the Bible says Yahshua MessiYah is our **only Savior**.

The Almighty Father said **He** is **I AM**. Yahshua MessiYah came to us proclaiming **He** is **I AM**. (John 8:24; John 8:58)

Yahshua said if we have seen **Him**, we have seen **the Father**. I believe Him!

Here are important questions that you, your family, your friends, your pastor, your church, your denomination, your tradition... and *all* of us must answer.

Do you believe **The Almighty Father** is the **only Savior** as **He Himself** says He is? ***Is the Father your Savior?***

Do you believe Yahshua MessiYah is the ‘**I AM**’ of Exodus 3:14, as **He** says He “**Truly, truly**” is? (John 8:58)

Do you believe Yahshua MessiYah is *The Almighty Father manifested in flesh who came to be our Savior?*

I pray **your** answers are ‘**Yes**’ and when proclaiming your Savior, you will say...

Yahshua MessiYah, The Almighty Father manifested in flesh, is my Savior.

Why I don’t attend a Trinitarian Church

Many Trinitarians have never examined the Trinity Doctrine for themselves. They do not know its origins or how it came to be. **They have accepted this doctrine even though nowhere in the Bible is the teaching of this doctrine found.**

What The New Encyclopedia Britannica says about the Trinity Doctrine:

“Neither the word Trinity nor the explicit doctrine appears in the New Testament.” In addition, Yale University professor E. Washburn Hopkins observed: “To Jesus and Paul the doctrine of the trinity was apparently unknown; they say nothing about it.”

Where did the Trinity Doctrine come from?

The Trinity Doctrine evolved under the influence of the Roman Catholic Church. It took over 300 years to formulate the main elements of this doctrine at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD.

Ultimately, the Catholic church forced believers to accept the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ or face condemnation, excommunication and worse. It is well documented in history that multitudes of people were tortured and put to death for refusing to accept the Trinity Doctrine. This fact alone should have sounded the alarm in the Christian world concerning this doctrine.

How did Protestants become Trinitarians?

*“At the time of the Reformation, the Protestant Church took over the doctrine of the Trinity (from the Catholic church), **without serious examination.**”*

*Most Protestant Trinitarians do not realize that the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ they espouse **comes from the Catholic church.***

Both Catholic and Protestant Trinitarians worship and pray to ‘three distinct persons’.

The Catholic Pope Francis told people on January 11, 2015,

*“We usually pray to **Jesus**,” Francis said. “When we pray the Our Father, we pray to the **Father**. But we don’t pray so much to the Holy Spirit. It is so important to pray to the **Holy Spirit.**”*

Quotes from well known Protestant websites:

“So our one God is present in **three persons**: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This is the doctrine of the Trinity. It is appropriate **to worship all three**, and we should be careful to ensure that our worship of one person of the Trinity does not overshadow our **worship of any other person** of the Trinity.”

“So, in general, pray to the Father; but occasionally, to express their Personhood and your own love for **them**, telling the Spirit and the Son that you love **them** and that you would like **them** to come in fullness is a good thing”.

“There is only one God, eternally existing in **three persons**: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Who are co-equal in their essential nature, attributes, and perfection; and **each of Whom is to be honored and worshiped as God**”.

Please look at the words used in these quotes.

“worship all three” “you love them” “each worshiped”

Does this sound like Biblical monotheism to you?

Both Catholic and Protestant Trinitarians are teaching people to worship and pray to **three distinct persons**!

This is totally **unscriptural** for it is **polytheism**.

Does your Trinitarian church (do you) condone praying to **three distinct persons**?

Trinitarian churches oppose The Almighty **Himself** by teaching He is ‘three distinct persons’

Because the Bible so clearly and so often tells us “*the LORD is our God, the LORD is one*”, Trinitarians by rote, will always emphatically say that there is one God. **However, here is the deception. The Trinitarians one God, is not the singular Almighty of scripture. The Trinitarians god is instead, one being that is comprised of ‘three distinct persons’.** But no matter how many times they say this, the concept in the minds of those who believe in the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ is of **three divine beings**. This amounts to thinking of The Almighty as three gods, regardless of any abstract metaphysical statements about their being “one in essence,” and regardless of the continually repeated statement that the three are one God.

In short, Trinitarians are actually thinking of three divine figures even though their lips are saying “one God.” **The practical reality is that the Trinity Doctrine is a polytheistic doctrine**—and even though its adherents have been trained to mechanically say, “There is one God,” **in reality they are picturing and worshipping three distinct persons.**

In the Old Testament, a person teaching The Almighty’s people to worship ‘three distinct persons’ would have been put to death

Moses met and spoke with The Almighty many times, twice for periods of 40 days each. Moses climbed Mt. Sinai eight times to meet with The Almighty.

The Almighty says of Moses,

“I speak with him directly, openly, and not in riddles, He sees the form of the LORD.”

Numbers 12:8

The Almighty said He speaks with Moses **“directly”, “openly”** and **“He sees the form of the LORD”**, yet Moses never wrote The Almighty is three persons. Moses did write,

Hear, Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one!

What Moses wrote and proclaimed agrees with both the Old and the New testament which tell us **there is but one God, the Father.** (Malachi 2:10; 1 Corinthians 8:6; Ephesians 4:6)

The Almighty **Himself** has told us He is One, but **never** that He is three.

What divides Jewish people from Trinitarianism is whether The Almighty is One (singular), or a composite of ‘three persons’. The bedrock of Judaism has always been strict monotheism - the belief that The Almighty is singular. This belief in one **singular** Almighty is what distinguished the Jewish people from their neighbors, who during antiquity were polytheistic.

The Jewish people have always safeguarded their monotheism against Trinitarian proselytizing. To them, the Catholic and Protestant ‘Trinity Doctrine’ is blasphemous, for they believe the ‘trinity god’ to be a different god than The Almighty God of Scripture.

How can the Jewish people (or any Believer) accept the ‘Trinity Doctrine’ which tells them the Almighty is comprised of ‘three distinct persons’, **when this refutes the very Words of the Almighty Father Himself?**

In the Bible, false prophets were people who claimed to speak the Word of God but instead spread false messages and teachings. The true prophet’s message always lined up with the Word of God in Scripture, whereas the false prophet’s teaching was inconsistent and contrary with what Scripture said.

Any prophet who contradicted what The Almighty had previously revealed in His Word proved himself to be false. To **protect** His people, The Almighty commanded false prophets be put to death.

The Bible says we have **one God, the Father**

The Apostle Paul tells us not once, but **two times** that there is **one God, the Father.** (1 Corinthians 8:6; Ephesians 4:6)

In His word, The Almighty has clearly told us He is One. The Jewish people undeniably understood that The Almighty was the Father and that He was a ‘*singular*’ One. They never received any instruction that their ‘singular’ Almighty was a triune being.

Trinitarian apologist, Robert M. Bowman, Jr., concedes that even the concept of a triune God **is not to be found** in the Old Testament:

“All trinitarians agree that the ideas about God expressed in the doctrine of the Trinity are not found directly in the Old Testament.”

Christian apologist Don Stewart explains why The Almighty is not understood to be a plurality of persons in the Old Testament:

“The doctrine of the Trinity was not clearly formulated until after the New Testament was written... The doctrine of the Trinity is not plainly revealed in the Old Testament.”

Edmund J. Fortman, professor of theology, says that the Old Testament’s authors **had not even the slightest idea that God was three in one, nor was there even an implication therein:**

“The Old Testament tells us nothing explicitly or by necessary implication of a Triune God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.... There is no evidence that any sacred writer even suspected the existence of a [Trinity] within the Godhead.... Even to see in the Old Testament suggestions or foreshadowing’s or ‘veiled signs’ of the Trinity of persons is to go beyond the words and intent of the sacred writers.”

“Thus, all of the forty-eight times ‘Almighty’ is used in the Old Testament, it is used with The Almighty Father in mind since this is who its authors and audience understood Him to be based on His own words.”

The Bible clearly tells us there is **“one God ... the Father.** Since we **know** that Yahshua is God, we **know** that He is the Father who was manifested in flesh to be our Savior.
